Subject: Permission for Mini COVID Care Centre in UT Chandigarh

Please refer to the discussion with Dr. G. Dewan, Ex-Director, Health Services regarding set-up and operate a Mini COVID Care Centre at Sports Complex, Sector 34, Chandigarh. The Chandigarh Administration greatly appreciates your noble gesture of again coming forward and contributing toward the management of this pandemic situation. During the month of May/June 2021 your organisation successfully operated a Mini COVID Care Centre and the services were appreciated by all. The partnership of good Samaritans from civil society like yourself with the Administration is the need of the hour. The brief outlines about functioning of the Mini COVID Care Centre are as follows, which may be suitably amended, from time to time:

1. <u>Concept:</u>The Chandigarh Administration has given a clarion call for setting up Mini COVID Centers in the City voluntarily by the interested organization/associations.Any Individual, Association, Voluntary Organization, NGO, Religious Organization, Corporate, Firm or Trust may come forward for setting up a Mini COVID Care Centre for asymptomatic COVID positive patients. Stay, food, medicines and every other facility in the Mini COVID Care Centre will be free. To be more precise, nothing will be charged from the patients.

Preferably the patients of nearby areas may be catered to. Patients may be discharged after the required isolation/medical as per the prescribed protocol. In case their health deteriorates in the Mini COVID Care Centre, they can be shifted to the appropriate hospital subject to availability of beds.

2. Basic Requirements to be arranged by your organization:

- i. Cots, mattresses and clean linen like pillows and bed-sheets etc
- ii. Provision of drinking water and healthy & nutritious simple food (may be packed food from outside)
- iii. The capacity of the Centre should not be less than 50 beds. About 80% beds should be Oxygenated and own arrangements for oxygen either through cylinders or through oxygen concentrators.
- iv. Doctor and Nursing Staff/Patient Care Attendants. Services of retired Doctors and Nurses may also be obtained. The Nursing Staff/Patient Care Attendants are required round the clock while doctors may be required for about three-four hours and then may be available on call

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v. Arrangements and round the clock availability of standard medicines which are required for COVID related issues, PPE Kits, Gloves, Mask &sanitizer and first-aid kits etc.

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- vi. Security Guards and Cleaning Staff
- vii. Responsible and qualified person to be designated as Manager to run the Care Center
- viii. Required number of fire-extinguishers
 - ix. Adequate number of dust bins

3. <u>Support by the Administration</u>

- i. Permission to set-up and operate the Mini-COVID Care Centre
- ii. Regulation of admission of patients to the Mini-COVID Care Centre
- iii. Periodic visit by Doctors for guidance
- iv. Arrangements of ambulance to shift the patients to appropriate hospital, in case their condition deteriorates (subject to availability of beds).
- v. Daily collection of garbage

You are hereby permitted to set-up the proposed Mini COVID Care Centre at the suggested place, initially for a period of two months. Shri Sorabh Kumar Arora, PCS, is assisting the undersigned and you may contact him in case of any need during the operation of the Mini COVID care Centre.

It may be ensured that the place is not used for any other purposes and its possession is handed over back to the same authority/organisation, in good condition, immediately after the prescribed period. For taking over the premises, you may contact the concerned authority/organisation with an undertaking in the enclosed format.
